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INDEX OF RETAIL PRICES—November, 2006 (Base: January, 2003 = 100)

## GENERAL INDEX

The All Items Index of Retail Prices calculated from prices collected for the month of November, 2006 was 126.8 representing an increase of 0.5 point or 0.4 % over the Index for October, 2006.

The annual rate of inflation as measured by the percentage change in the average All Items Index for the period January–November, 2005 was 8.3%. ## SECTION INDICES

### FOOD AND NON-ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

The Index for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages rose from 197.8 in October, 2006 to 200.8 in November, 2006, reflecting an increase of 1.5 %. Contributing to this increase was a general rise in the prices of chicken, fish (king and carite), celery, tomatoes, hot peppers, apples, limes, bodie, sweet potatoes, chive and (carbonated) soft drinks. Partly offsetting these increases were general price decreases in oranges, cucumbers, Irish potatoes, carrots, ochroes, grapes, onion and yams.

Price changes in this section, for the month of November, 2006 accounted for a net overall increase of 0.5 point in the All Items Index.

#### OTHER SECTIONS

A further review of the data for November, 2006 compared with October, 2006 indicated an increase in the general price level for Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco 1.8%. However, price decreases were noted for Clothing and Footwear 0.4% and Health 0.7%.

Price changes in these sections for the month of November, 2006 resulted in a negligible net overall change in the All Items Index.
