TEMPORARY OFFICES OF MAGISTRATE (GROUP J4), JUDICIARY (MAGISTRACY)

APPLICATIONS are invited from suitably qualified officers in your Ministry/Department for the temporary offices of Magistrate, Judiciary (Magistracy).

PARTICULARS RELATING TO THE OFFICE ARE GIVEN HEREUNDER

Required Qualifications, Experience and Skills

Minimum qualifications: LLB—Bachelor of Law and a LEC—Legal Education Certificate.

Admission to practise Law in Trinidad and Tobago.

Minimum experience: Five (5) years working experience as an Attorney-at-law.

Knowledge and understanding of the Laws and Regulations of Trinidad and Tobago.

Knowledge of the practices and rules of procedures in the Magistrates' Courts

Good management and supervisory skills.

Good communication skills both written and oral.

Good analytical and reasoning skills.

Good problem solving skills.

Major Duties and Responsibilities

Judicial

1. Issues:

Summonses to persons to appear in Court as defendants or witnesses.

Warrants for the arrest of persons who have failed to attend Court after being properly summoned or granted bail.

2. Acts as Judge and Jury in criminal summary cases and this includes determining the admissibility of evidence, hearing cases for the Prosecution and the defence, assessing relative merits and demerits, pronouncing judgment and determining the appropriate sentence.

3. Where legislation provides and the accused elects to have an indictable matter heard summarily, the Magistrate will hear and determine such matters.

4. In indictable matters, the Magistrate enquires whether a prima facie case is made out (whether there is sufficient evidence) for referral to the High Court, or may discharge the accused as the case may be.

5. Sits as Coroner under the Coroner's Act, conducting inquests into unnatural deaths and fires.

6. Determines whether to grant bail to persons who are awaiting trial or the determination of an appeal.

7. Sits as Judge of the Petty Civil Court and adjudicates in certain civil matters.

8. Exercises jurisdiction in family matters, matters affecting the custody and maintenance of children, matters of domestic violence and juveniles brought before the Court.

9. Adjudicates in ejection proceedings (Landlord/Tenant disputes).

10. Serves on tribunals as required e.g., Mental Health, Agricultural, etc.

11. Prepares and submits to the Court of Appeal, written reasons for decisions that are the subject to appeal.

12. Manages the proceedings in Court.

Performs related duties as may be required.
