MADE BY THE MINISTER AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE CHIEF JUSTICE
UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)
(NO. 7) ORDER, 2017

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 7) Order, 2017.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule, being a Commonwealth citizen admitted to practise law in England and Wales for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule.

PART I

Mr. Richard Anthony Clayton, QC	Of the Honourable Society of Middle Temple: Barrister, admitted to practise at the Bar of England and Wales in November, 1977 and was appointed Queen's Counsel in 2002.

PART II

Mr. Richard Anthony Clayton, QC, is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an Attorney-at-law in relation to the following causes and any matters, suits or other proceedings arising out of or in connection with the causes, namely:

C.V. 2016–04288—Noel Garcia v. Justice Mustapha Ibrahim, Dr. Myron Wing-Sang Chin c/o CEP Ltd., Mr. Anthony Farrell and the Attorney General of Trinidad and Tobago.

C.V. 2016–04448—John Calder Hart v. the Commission of Enquiry into the entire process which led to the construction of the Las Alturas Housing Towers at Lady Young Gardens, Morvant, Justice Mustapha Ibrahim, Dr. Myron Wing-Sang Chin and Mr. Anthony Farrell and the Attorney General of Trinidad and Tobago.
