## REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE WITH THE CONSENT OF THE MINISTER OF WORKS AND TRANSPORT UNDER SECTION 67(1) OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

## THE TRAFFIC CONTROL (EXPERIMENTAL SCHEME) (ARIMA) REGULATIONS, 2017

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Traffic Control Citation (Experimental Scheme) (Arima) Regulations, 2017.

2. These Regulations shall commence on Monday 30th October, Duration 2017 and expire on Monday 29th January, 2018.

3. Taxis shall ply for hire as follows:

```
Taxi stand
```

- (a) a maximum of twelve taxis plying the Arima to Sangre Grande route shall park on the eastern side of Prince Street facing south, between De Gannes Street and Sorzano Street, as marked; and
- (b) a maximum of five taxis plying the Arima to Valencia route shall park on the eastern side of Queen Street facing south, between Sorzano Street and Broadway, as marked.

4. A person driving a motor vehicle shall not park that motor Parking vehicle on the eastern side of Prince Street, between De Gannes Street <sup>prohibited</sup> and Sorzano Street.

5. A person who contravenes these Regulations is liable on Offence and summary conviction, for a first offence, to a fine of seven hundred and <sup>penalty</sup> fifty dollars and on any subsequent conviction, to a fine of one thousand dollars.

6. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the Removal and commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked  $_{vehicles}^{impounding of}$  in contravention of these Regulations, may be removed by the unlawfully Police Service and impounded and dealt with in accordance with  $_{parked}^{parked}$  section 108(1)(b) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act.
