ORDER

MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE UNDER SECTION 68(1) OF THE  
MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE TRAFFIC RESTRICTION (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS)  
(ARIMA MILITARY PARADE) ORDER, 2018

1. This Order may be cited as the Traffic Restriction (Temporary Provisions) (Arima Military Parade) Order, 2018.

2. This Order shall have effect from 8.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. on Sunday 12th August, 2018.

3. A driver of a motor vehicle entering Arima—

Vehicular  
traffic routes

(a) from the west, along the Eastern Main Road, north onto Industry Street, east onto Anglican Street, north onto King Street, east onto de Gannes Street, south onto Prince Street, east onto El Carmen Street, east along Columbus Street to Moreno Street, east onto Guanapo Street, and then onto the Eastern Main Road;

(b) from the east, along Guanapo Street, south onto Quesnel Street, continuing west and then south onto Pro Queen Street or west along Guanapo Street, north onto Thano Street, west onto Columbus Street, north onto Prince Street, west onto de Gannes Street, south onto King Street, west onto Anglican Street, south onto Industry Street, and then west onto the Eastern Main Road; and

(c) from the south, along Cocorite Street and west onto Quesnel Street, onto Pro Queen Street, west onto Robinson Circular, north onto Queen Mary Avenue and then west onto the Eastern Main Road.

4. A driver of a maxi-taxi proceeding east along the Priority Bus Route shall turn north onto Railway Road, north onto Anglican Street, north along King Street, east onto Sanchez Street, south onto St. Joseph Street and then onto the Priority Bus Route maxi-taxi stand.

- Eastern Main Road maxi-taxi stand      5. A driver of a maxi-taxi on the Eastern Main Road proceeding to Arima shall turn north onto Industry Street, east along Anglican Street, north onto King Street, east onto Rose Street, north onto St. Joseph Street and then onto the Eastern Main Road maxi-taxi stand.
- Priority Bus Route bus      6. A driver of a bus proceeding east along the Priority Bus Route shall turn north onto Railway Road, north onto Queen Mary Avenue, west onto John Shaw Avenue and onto the stand on the southern side of John Shaw Avenue, facing west in front of the Health Centre.
- Bus routes      7. A driver of a Public Transport Service Corporation bus proceeding to—
- (a) Arima from the east, along Guanapo Street, shall proceed west onto Quesnel Street, south onto Pro Queen Street, west along Robinson Circular, north along Queen Mary Avenue to stop alongside the Arima District Hospital; and
  - (b) Sangre Grande, shall proceed north along Industry Street, east along Anglican Street, north along King Street, east along de Gannes Street, south along Prince Street, east onto El Carmen Street, onto Columbus Street, south onto Moreno Street, and east onto Guanapo Street.
- Taxi stands      8. A driver of a taxi shall operate—
- (a) a Port-of-Spain taxi, from the southern side of Broadway, between St. Joseph Street and King Street, facing west;
  - (b) a Mausica Old Road taxi, from lower King Street facing north;
  - (c) a Mt. Pleasant taxi, from higher Prince Street, facing north, on the western side, between Sanchez Street and Church Street;
  - (d) a Calvary Hill taxi, from higher Prince Street facing north, on the western side between Sanchez Street and Church Street;
  - (e) a Cumuto and Pinto Road taxi, from—
    - (i) Guanapo Street, facing east, on the northern side; and
    - (ii) Sangre Grande/Valencia taxi-stand to the southern side in the vicinity of Massy Stores;
  - (f) a Cocorite Road and La Horquetta taxi, from Cocorite Road, on the western side, facing south in the vicinity of Maurice Avenue;

- (g) a Malabar and Carapo taxi, from Loubon Street, on the southern side, facing west; and
- (h) a Calvary Hill taxi, from higher Woodford Street on the western side facing north between Sanchez Street and Church Street;

9. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in contravention of this Order may be removed and impounded by a police officer in accordance with section 108(1)(b) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act. <sup>Removal and impounding of vehicles unlawfully parked</sup>
