

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STRUCTURE OF THE PCA



By virtue of Section 6 (1) of the PCA Act the Authority comprises a Director and Deputy Director who are appointed by the President on the joint advice of the Prime Minister and the Leader of the Opposition.

The Authority has direct operational responsibility for the PCA's three (4) main units namely

- Investigations Legal Counsel, Compliance and Complaints Administration / Operations
- Advocate Attorney

INVESTIGATIONS

Investigation IONI The Investigations Team is the largest team in the PCA with its prime focus being the investigating of complaints, that is, criminal offences involving police officers, police corruption and serious police miscroduct in strict accordance with the requirements of the PCA Act and the delivery of excellent service on a consistent

LEGAL COUNSEL, COMPLIANCE AND COMPLAINTS The Legal Counsel, Compliance and Complaints Team focuses on the provision of efficient, effective and high quality legal services to the PCA with respect to the investigation of criminal offences involving police officers, police corruption, serious police misconduct and for other related matters. Further, the Legal Counsel, Compliance and Complaints Team ensures effective follow-up and liaison between the PCA and the Director of Public Prosecutions/Police Service Commission/Commissioner of Police and all other persons or bodies whether public or private with whom the PCA works in cooperation with or in association with in the performance of its functions.

The Team ensures the PCA's compliance with all statutory and regulatory requirements and provides the requisite assistance in the execution of the overall functions of the Authority.

Finance & Accounts

Finance & Accounts The Finance and Accounts Unit overlooks the entire system of monitoring and control of finances of the Authority in accordance with general accounting principles and practices.
