COVID-19 Emergency Directions

These Practice Directions are issued pursuant to **Rules 1.3 and 1.5 of the Equal Opportunity Tribunal Rules 2016.**

In order to safeguard the health of staff and members of the public during the novel coronavirus ('COVID-19') emergency in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, and to ensure business continuity with minimal inconvenience to all stakeholders, the Equal Opportunity Tribunal ('the Tribunal') will implement the following measures from Monday March 16, 2020 to such other date as may be notified by the Tribunal ('this period'): -

COURT HEARINGS DURING THIS PERIOD

1. Sittings of the Tribunal are suspended save and except matters deemed by the Tribunal to be fit for hearing in this period.
2. In appropriate cases, applications may be dealt with, without a hearing and email notifications of orders may be issued.
3. All Hearings and Trials dates fixed for during this period are vacated. Attorneys for the Parties shall be advised in the usual way of the date and time of the new hearings.

DEEMING MATTERS FIT FOR HEARING IN THIS PERIOD

4. The Tribunal may on its own motion, deem a matter fit for hearing in this period.
5. Any party or intended party in a matter may apply to have the matter or any application pertaining thereto deemed fit for hearing in this period.
6. A Notice of Application (Form No. 4) must be made and must be accompanied by an affidavit setting out the facts and reasons which make the application fit for hearing in this period. The Application may be sent to the Registry by via email to eot.courtstaff@gov.tt.
7. Where hearings are impractical, hearings may be telephonic or by video conference and or attendance at any in-court hearing may be limited to Attorneys, parties and necessary witnesses.

DEADLINES AND TRIAL DATES

8. With respect to filing dates and or deadlines which will become due and or have been the subject of previous orders issued by the Tribunal and which will expire during this period, deadline will be extended to May 8, 2020 or such other date as may be notified by the Tribunal.

RESERVED JUDGMENTS

9. The Tribunal shall deliver its reserved judgments by e-mail as and when the same are ready for delivery. Attorneys for the Parties shall be advised in the usual way of the date and time of delivery.

OPENING OF REGISTRY

10. The Registry will be closed during this period until otherwise notified.

OTHER MATTERS

11. In the interest of public health and safety and in order to maintain the appropriate social distancing, attendance at the Tribunal building may be limited to attorneys, parties and necessary witnesses. Attorneys are encouraged to utilise, and the Tribunal will as far as practicable use, telephonic, emails, video technology and digital methods for communication.
12. The Tribunal may establish screening standards as well as health and safety protocols for entry into the court building. Persons may be denied entry into the building if they display flu like symptoms related to Covid-19, or otherwise fail to meet the screening standards required for entry.

REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF A PRIVATE WAREHOUSE
(*Customs Act, Chap. 78:01*)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Comptroller of Customs and Excise under the provisions of the Customs Act, Chap. 78:01, I, Kathy Ann Matthews, acting Comptroller of Customs and Excise, do hereby revoke the place specified in the Schedule hereunder to be a Private Warehouse, which said place was appointed a Private Warehouse by the Comptroller of Customs and Excise for the warehousing of bar soap, liquid soap, body spray, shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, deodorant, disinfectant for the storage, pending entry for home consumption or export, of the following goods, as shall be warehoused by or in the Private Warehouse of Messrs Unilever Caribbean Limited, Eastern Main Road, Champs Fleurs under the provisions of section 263(2) of the Customs Act, Chap. 78:01 and which said appointment was published as Notice No: 1933, Vol. 51 on Tuesday 16th October, 2012 in the *Trinidad and Tobago Gazette* No. 165.

SCHEDULE

An area totaling 2,131.19 square metres, comprising of two rectangular areas located within the northern-left and northern-central section of the 1st building west to east (Restrite Building) on the Unilever Caribbean Limited Compound leased from Kirrayne Limited and situate on the corner of Industrial Lane and the Eastern Main Road, Champ Fleurs in the County of St. George.

The dimensions of the Private Warehouse starting with one rectangular area in the northern-left section of the building referred to in the first paragraph of this schedule are: 30.48 metres east to west and 22.40 metres north to south comprising a total of 719.91 square metres (including that portion of a recessed area to the south-west totalling of 37.16 square metres) and is enclosed by concrete walls on the north, south and west constructed to a height of 3.2 metres and B.R.C. wire mesh on the east constructed to a height of 3.2 metres, with a concrete roof which forms the mezzanine floor of part of the General Warehouse (total area of this portion of the General Warehouse is 1,998.3 square metres), with built-in-gates located on the south and east constructed partly of iron and B.R.C. wire mesh to a height of 3.0 metres and width of 3.0 metres through which access is gained. This area is bounded on the east by Raw and Packaging Store Room and abutted by a drain that separates the building referred to in the first paragraph of this schedule from the remaining portion of the Unilever Caribbean Limited Compound; on the west by Industry Lane; on the north by a solid concrete wall abutted by lands and buildings of West Indian Tobacco Company Limited and on the south by part of the Private Warehouse abutted by part of the General Warehouse and Dispatch Area abutted by the Eastern Main Road.

The other area being a rectangular area in the northern-central section of the aforementioned building measures 60.96 metres east to west and 24.37 metres north to south comprising a total of 1,411.28 square metres (excluding those portions of recessed area to the north-west and north-east totaling 74.32 square metres) and is enclosed partly by concrete walls and B.R.C. wire mesh on the north, south and east constructed to a height of 3.29 metres, 4.10 metres and 4.0 metres respectively, and a solid concrete wall on the west constructed to a height of 7.16 metres, with a B.R.C. wire mesh on the western portion constructed to a height of 9.14 metres used as an internal divider with built-in-gates, partly covered by a concrete roof which forms the mezzanine floor of part of the General Warehouse (total area of this portion of the General Warehouse is 594.28 metres), with two built-in gates located on the south through which access is gained and a ramped area with a built-in gate on the north which leads to part of the Private Warehouse. This area is bounded on the east by a drain that separates the building referred to in the first paragraph of this schedule from the remaining portion of the Unilever Caribbean Limited Compound; on the west by Industry Lane; on the north by part of the Private Warehouse and the Raw and Packaging Store Room abutted by a solid concrete wall abutted by lands and buildings of West Indian Tobacco Company Limited and on the south by part of the General Warehouse and Dispatch Area abutted by the Eastern Main Road.

THE GOVERNMENT of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago has received financing from the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) toward the cost of Health Services Support Program (HSSP), and it intends to apply part of the proceeds of this financing to payments under the Contract for the Procurement of Physical Education (PE) Equipment for Government and Government-Assisted Primary Schools.

The Central Tenders Board (CTB), on behalf of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Health now invites sealed tenders from eligible bidders for the Procurement of Physical Education (PE) Equipment for Government and Government-Assisted Primary Schools.
