By Trinidad and Tobago Gazette (Extraordinary) Vol 61 No. 45 dated March 22nd 2022, the Office of the Attorney General and Ministry of Legal Affairs ('the Ministry') was tasked with the responsibility of the following Statutory Boards and other Bodies, some of which have not published their Freedom of Information Statements as required under the FOIA:

According to section 7 of the FOIA, these Authorities are required to publish annual FOIA statements in the Gazette and in at least one daily newspaper in Trinidad and Tobago. The Authorities which did not publish their annual FOIA Statements were unable to do so for the reasons contained below:

- 1. The Authorities, in compliance with the various Regulations and Guidelines issued by the Office of the Prime Minister and Ministry of Health, together with the Guidelines issued by the Service Commission Department and Chief Personnel Officer's Department in response to the Coronavirus Disease of 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic has been operating at a reduced capacity. The Authorities wish to highlight that since 2020, their services have continuously been affected by mandatory office closures, restrictions in operating hours, restrictions in service provision, staff quarantine orders, staff rotations and office sanitations. Consequently, the Authorities have been constrained in directing its limited resources to the provision of essential services.
- A State of Emergency was proclaimed by the President of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago on May 15th 2021 which involved a curfew, which was meant to reduce the spread of the Covid-19 virus. This interrupted working conditions. The State of Emergency ended on November 17th 2021.





Public Statement of the Office of the Attorney General and Ministry of Legal Affairs as at December 31st 2021

In Compliance with Section 7 (4) of

The Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 1999

Section 7 (4)

Reasons for the failure to publish statements as required under section 7 for the period 2016-2021

The Office of the Attorney General and Ministry of Legal Affairs ("the Ministry") regrets to advise that for the period 2016 to 2021, it was unable to publish its statements as is required under Section 7 of the Freedom of Information Act, 1999 ("the Act"). The inability to publish the Ministry's Statements was due to the following reasons:

- 1. The Ministry conducted a search of its records and found that no Statement was published by the Ministry of the Attorney General for the period 2010-2015. Furthermore, the Ministry of Legal Affairs last published a Statement in 2010 and thereafter did not publish any for the period 2011-2015. The Ministry of Justice published its only Statement in 2014. Therefore, the records for historical years were difficult to collate.
- 2. In September of 2015, the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago undertook the extensive exercise of merging the former Ministry of the Attorney General, Ministry of Legal Affairs and part of the Ministry of Justice into one (1) Ministry, now called the Office of the Attorney General and Ministry of Legal Affairs. As a result of such a resource-intensive exercise, and in the interest of preventing any disruptions to the provision and access of services, the Ministry resolved to focus its resources on the following:
 - The relocation of staff from the previously-named Ministries to one (1) central location at the Government Campus Plaza, AGLA Tower;
 - Reclassification and harmonization of job functions:
 - iii. Incorporation and harmonization of services; and
 - iv. Specialist training of staff.

While the physical merging of the Ministry prolonged two (2) years, the logistical restructuring of the Ministry expanded six (6) years. Consequently, the Ministry was incapacitated in its ability to draft and publish the required statements.

- 3. Furthermore, these matters were compounded by the fact, that during said period, the Ministry had to address the issue of the turnover in persons holding the position of Administrative Officer V. During the period the Ministry had three (3) different officers in the position. Each officer did not hold the position for any lengthy period of time and this hindered the preparation of the statements required under the Act. The current Administrative Officer V is addressing all matters that come under her purview. The turnover of persons holding the Administrative Officer V has stymied some functions of the Ministry.
- 4. The Ministry, in compliance with the various Regulations and Guidelines issued by the Office of the Prime Minister and Ministry of Health, together with the Guidelines issued by the Service Commission Department and Chief Personnel Officer's Department in response to the Coronavirus Disease of 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic has been operating at a reduced capacity. The Ministry wishes to highlight that since 2020, it's services have continuously been affected by mandatory office closures, restrictions in operating hours, restrictions in service provision, staff quarantine orders, staff rotations and office sanitations. Consequently, the Ministry has been constrained in directing its limited resources to the provision of essential services.

The Ministry sincerely apologises for any inconvenience caused by the non-publishing of its required statements for the period 2016-2021 and assures that its statement for 2022 will be published at the earliest opportunity.

In accordance with Sections 7, 8 and 9 of the Freedom of Information Act, 1999 (FOIA) the Ministry of Planning and Development is required by law to publish the following statement, which lists the documents and information generally available to the public.

The statement also lists the categories of documents that are available for inspection by the public and how to access the documents.

The Ministry of Planning and Development was established in October 2015. The Ministry is responsible for the National Framework for Sustainable Development, Economic Management, Planning, Coordinating, Monitoring, Priority Setting and developing the Nation's Five Growth Poles, Coordinating and Monitoring Strategic Plans, National Human Development, National Innovation System, National Manpower Planning, Population, National Statistics, Town and Country Planning, Technical Co-operation (Projects and Programmes) the Public Sector Investment Programme (PSIP) and the Public Sector Maintenance Programme (PSMP), Development and Monitoring of the Environmental Management Policy and Coordinating the Implementation of Multilateral Environmental Agreements to which the Ministry of Planning and Development is assigned as a National Focal Point.

The following information is published by the Ministry of Planning and Development with the approval of the Minister of Planning and Development.

The FOIA gives members of the public:-

- (1) A legal right for each person to access information held by the Ministry of Planning and Development.
- (2) A legal right for each person to have official information relating to him/herself amended where it is incomplete, incorrect or misleading.
- (3) A legal right to obtain reasons for adverse decisions made regarding an applicant's request for information under FOIA.
- (4) A legal right to complain to the Ombudsman and to apply to the High Court for Judicial Review to challenge adverse decisions made under the FOIA.

Mission and Vision Statements:-



Organizational Structure and Staffing

The Ministry of Planning and Development is headed by the Permanent Secretary. The Ministry has established and contracted positions comprising Clerical, Technical/Professional, Secretarial, Administrative and Manipulative staff. The core Ministry is divided into Divisions/Sections/Units, as outlined in the following Organizational Chart:-

The Ministry's major functions include:-

- Coordinating, accessing and allocating technical co-operation in support for National Institutions and Civil Society.
- Planning for the development of the Country's manpower resources and coordinating the national statistical system.
- Providing high quality, current information and statistics relevant to the societies need.
- Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) of the implementation of the National Development Policy.
- Re-engineering the delivery system for land use and land development to ensure greater involvement of the Municipal and Regional Corporations and the public employing a comprehensive and accepted policy framework for decision-making on land use and land development.
- Assisting in the preparation and review of up-to-date planning legislation aimed at streamlining the planning system.

Socio-Economic Policy Planning Division

The Socio-Economic Policy Planning Division is located at Level 17, Tower D, International Waterfront Centre, 1 Wrightson Road, Port of Spain.

The Division is responsible for the articulation and review of short-term, medium-term and long-term Socio-Economic Development Planning Frameworks for Trinidad and Tobago. These Policy Frameworks provide the parameters for the following:-

- Developing sectoral reform initiatives by Government Ministries and Agencies
- To address sectoral deficiencies
- Ensuring consistency between public polices, the PSIP and Central Government plans
- Coordinating inter-sectoral policies and strategies
- Research and analysis of domestic and international economic and socio-economic trends and issues
- On-going review and assessment of the impact of policies, programmes and projects

The Project Planning and Reconstruction Division

The Project Planning and Reconstruction Division is located on Level 17, Tower D, International Waterfront Centre, 1 Wrightson Road, Port of Spain. The Division is responsible for the preparation, monitoring and evaluation of the country's annual and three-year Public Sector Investment Programmes in accordance with the requirements of the Minister of Finance Call Circular.

The Core Functions of the Division include:-

- Allocating resources efficiently among a set of programmes and projects that have been vigorously and carefully selected on the basis of established criteria, such as job creation, foreign exchange generated, sustainability and propensity to achieve Government's macro policy objectives;
- Securing for the PSIP, adequate resources on the most beneficial terms and conditions, this includes both loan and grant resources from the major Multi- Lateral Agencies such as the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), the World Bank, European Union (EU) and the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB);
- Developing the framework for planning, financing and implementing capital projects and in particular the procedures for screening project proposals (Project Screening Brief) of projects for inclusion in the PSIP;
- Evaluating the developmental impacts of projects and programmes based on resource utilization, benefits accrued, best practices learnt, strengths and weaknesses in project design;
- Developing proper mechanism to enable and encourage feedback from client Ministries and other key stakeholders on project implemented;
- Co-ordinating and managing PSIP implementation to facilitate optimization of the use of the resources, proactive monitoring, interaction and encouraging the timely flow of accurate and reliable information from client Ministries;
- Assisting executing Agencies in the effective implementation of the projects and programmes for which these resources have been allocated, by way of upgrading the skills and capabilities of implementing Agencies in project cycle management and operating systems and providing technical advice relating to project cycle;
- Acting as a liaison between Multi-lateral Agencies and the Government on matters relating to loan and grant programmes;

Central Statistical Office

The CSO executes its functions in accordance with the Statistics Act, Chapter 19:02 of the revised Laws of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago.

The core functions of the CSO in relation to the Statistics Act are:-

- Data collection Collection of accurate primary and secondary data in a timely and efficient manner;
- Data processing The transformation of raw data into information/data dissemination;
- Marketing Building public awareness of available statistical products and promotion of interface with users;
- Monitoring and evaluation of the statistical function;
- Consultancy and Training Provision of expert services on a commercial basis;
- Statistical co-ordination of the National Statistical Systems.

The core functions of the Town and Country Planning Division are:

- Evaluating and determining planning applications on behalf of the Minister;
- Permission to develop land and for the display of advertisement;
- Providing an up-to-date database of land use planning data and information for decision making on land use and land development;
- Maintaining registers for planning decisions;

- Developing and keeping under review a comprehensive framework, local area, regional plans, and a national physical development framework to guide decision making on the use and development of land;
- Assisting in the preparation and review of relevant planning legislation;
- Enforcement of planning control.

National Transformation Unit (NTU)

The National Transformation Unit (NTU) is located at Level 17, Tower D, International Waterfront Centre, 1 Wrightson Road, Port of Spain.

The NTU was established by Cabinet Minute 1057 (2nd Session) of October 14, 2010 and is the overarching body for Monitoring and Evaluation in the public sector. The NTU is mandated 'inter alia to:-

- Implement the Medium Term Action Plan (MTAP) for building assessment and evaluation capability for Trinidad and Tobago, which includes building public sector capacity in M&E tools, methods, approaches and concepts, developing indicators, setting targets, use of logic model for measuring outcomes and conduct of evaluations;
- ▶ Coordinate the implementation of the National Policy and Strategic Plans;
- ▶ Establish a reporting framework against the National Policy of the Government and Ministries' Strategic Plans;
- ▶ Produce an Annual Report on the progress of government policies, programmes and projects in accordance with agreed targets and performance measures;
- ▶ Develop an Information Technology System to track performance data and outcomes;
- Serve as the management centre for national and sectoral evaluations of projects and programmes;
- ▶ Build a public sector wide Assessment and Evaluation Network;
- ▶ Build awareness of the evaluation and transformation processes and their value for development, good practices and successes.

Technical Co-operation Unit

The Technical Co-operation Unit is located on Level 22, Nicholas Tower, Corner of Independence Square and Abercrombie Streets, Port of Spain.

The Technical Co-operation Unit serves as the national focal point for interfacing with Governments, Regional and International agencies on technical cooperation, and for accessing and facilitating technical exchanges towards sustainable development.

The core functions of the Technical Co-operation Unit include:-

- Formulating programmes/projects of a technical cooperation nature in accordance with policy;
- Assessing the demand for and supply of technical cooperation to contribute to the priority needs of the country;

- Providing information on technical cooperation opportunities to public sector agencies and civil society;
- Accessing all possible sources of technical cooperation to meet identified needs;
- Coordination among donor agencies to ensure that there is no overlap or gaps;
- Facilitating Technical Cooperation between Trinidad and Tobago and other developing countries;
- ▶ Coordinating, monitoring and reporting on the operationalization of the Country Implementation Plan for Trinidad and Tobago (CIP-TT) under the Multi-country Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (MSDCF) 2022 2026;
- Assist with all SDG-related matters.

European Development Fund (EDF) Unit

The EDF Unit is located at Level 7, Tower C, International Waterfront Centre, 1 Wrightson Road, Port of Spain. The Unit was established in January 2001 to co-ordinate and facilitate the implementation of the National Indicative Programme agreed between the GORTT and the European Development Fund.

The Permanent Secretary is designated as the National Authorizing Officer (NAO) for the Programme:

The core functions of the European Development Fund Unit include:-

- Assisting in the preparation of the Country Support Strategy and other documentation required for accessing EDF funds;
- Liaising with Ministries, Agencies, the private sector and NGO'S in order to identify projects that can lead to a commitment of funds;
- Assisting Ministries/Agencies, the private sector and NGO'S in preparing Terms of Reference, Tender Dossiers and project related documents.

Planning Division

The Planning Division is located at Level 13, Eric Williams Finance Building, Independence Square, Port of Spain. The Planning Division is tasked with guiding and coordinating the development and implementation of the Ministry's Development programme and monitoring, evaluation and reporting on projects directed towards aligning Divisional Projects in accordance with the Ministry's strategic objectives.

Environmental Policy and Planning Division

The Environmental Policy and Planning Division (EPPD) is located at Level 7, Tower C, International Waterfront Complex, 1 Wrightson Road, Port of Spain. The primary mission of the EPPD is to ensure that there is a balance between Government's efforts to increase the pace of socio-economic development and the need to ensure conservation of Trinidad and Tobago's natural resources. This is the heart of sustainable development and is the foundation of the mission, programmes and projects undertaken by the Division.

- Conduct of research to inform the formulation of Environmental Policy;
- ▶ Promotion and facilitation of Government's efforts to promote Sustainable Development;
- ▶ Coordinating and monitoring the implementation of the Multilateral Environmental Agreements (MEAs) to which the Ministry of Planning and Development has been designated as National Focal Point;
- Working in close collaboration with the Governmental and Non-Governmental stakeholders in policy implementation;
- Assisting in the identification and mobilization of Financial and Technical assistance to support Government's efforts to promote Sustainable Development;
- Representing the Ministry on Technical Committees;
- Representing the Ministry/Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago at Regional and International Meetings/Conferences.

Green Fund Executing Unit

The Green Fund Executing Unit is located at Level 7, Tower C, International Waterfront Centre, 1 Wrightson Road, Port of Spain.

How to Request Information:-

General - The Ministry's Policy is to respond to all requests for information in writing. In order to have the rights provided under the FOIA a request must be made in writing on the appropriate form, that is, the "Request for Access to Official Documents" form.

Addressing Requests - To facilitate prompt handling of requests for access to information, the completed requisition form should be addressed to the Designated Officer, Ministry of Planning and Development.

Details in the Requests - Applicants should provide details that will allow for ready identification and location of the records that are being requested. If insufficient information is provided clarification will be sought from the applicant. If the applicant is unsure how to make the request or the details to be included, he or she should communicate with the Ministry's Designated Officer.

Requests Not Handled under the FOIA

A request under the FOIA to access information that is currently available in the public domain, for example in the form of Brochures and Pamphlets, will not be made available.

Responding to a Request for Access to Information

Retrieving Documents

The Ministry of Planning and Development is only required to furnish copies of documents currently in its possession or when the said documents could be retrieved from storage.

Time Limits

General - The FOIA establishes time limits for the Ministry to make a decision regarding its ability to disclose the documents requested. Requests will be acknowledged and the applicant advised of the status. If the time limit is not met, the FOIA gives the applicant the right to proceed as if his/her request has been denied.

The Ministry will diligently try to comply with the time limits, but if it appears that processing the request may take longer than the statutory limit, the applicant will be asked to agree to an extension of time, since there is a possibility that requests might not have been addressed correctly or was misrouted, the applicant may wish to call or write to the Designated Officer to confirm that the Ministry received the request and to ascertain its status.

Time Allowed - in compliance with section 15 of the FOIA, the Ministry will determine whether **to** grant or deny the request for access to information as soonas practicable but no later than 30 days.
