THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, CHAP. 48:50

REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE WITH THE CONSENT OF THE  
MINISTER OF WORKS AND TRANSPORT UNDER SECTION 67(1) OF  
THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE TRAFFIC CONTROL (EXPERIMENTAL SCHEME)  
(ST. CLAIR) REGULATIONS, 2011

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Traffic Control Citation  
(Experimental Scheme) (St. Clair) Regulations, 2011.

2. These Regulations shall have effect from Monday 13th June, Duration  
2011 to Monday 12th September, 2011.

3. Motorists shall proceed in—

- (a) a southerly direction on Maraval Road, between Marli  
Street and Tragarete Road;
- (b) a westerly direction on Rust Street, between Maraval Road  
and Gray Street;
- (c) an easterly direction on Alcazar Street, between Maraval  
Road and Gray Street; and
- (d) a westerly direction on Herbert Street, between Maraval  
Road and Gray Street.

One-way  
traffic

4. Motorists shall proceed in both directions on Prada Street, from  
Newbold Street to Maraval Road.

Two-way  
traffic

5. Parking is prohibited on both sides of Maraval Road, between  
Herbert Street and Tragarete Road, between the hours of 6.00 a.m. and  
6.00 p.m. from Monday to Friday except public holidays.

Parking  
prohibited

6. A person who contravenes any of the provisions of these  
Regulations is liable on summary conviction for a first offence to a fine  
of seven hundred and fifty dollars, and on any subsequent conviction, to  
a fine of one thousand dollars.

Offence and  
penalty

Removal and  
impounding  
of vehicles  
unlawfully  
parked

7. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in contravention of these Regulations, may be removed by the Police and impounded and dealt with in accordance with section 108(1)(b) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act.
