Our policy is to answer all requests, both oral and written, for information. However, in order to have the rights given to you by the FOIA (for example the right to challenge a decision if your request for information is refused), you must make your request in writing. The applicant must, therefore, complete the appropriate form (Request for Access to Official

Documents) which is available in any Public Authority in order to access information that is not readily available in the public domain.

▪ Addressing Requests

To facilitate prompt handling of your request, please address it to the Designated Officer of the HDC (see Section 7 (1) (a) (vi)).

▪ Details in the Request

Applicants should provide details that will allow for ready identification and location of the records that are being requested. If insufficient information is provided clarification will be sought from the applicant. If you are not sure how to write your request or what details to include, you can communicate with the Designated Officer.

Requests not handled under the FOIA

- A request under the FOIA will not be processed to the extent that it asks for information which is readily available in the public domain, either from the IIDC or from another public authority, for example brochures and pamphlets etc.

Responding to your Request

▪ Retrieving Documents

The IIDC is required to furnish copies of documents only when they are in our possession or we can retrieve them from storage. Information stored in the National Archives or another storage center, will be retrieved in order to process your request.

▪ Furnishing Documents

Subject to some exceptions, as indicated in the FOIA, an applicant is entitled to copies of information in the possession, custody or power of the IIDC. The IIDC is required to furnish only one copy of a document. If the IIDC cannot make a legible copy of a document to be released, we may not attempt to reconstruct it. Instead, the IIDC will furnish the best copy possible and note its quality in our reply.

Please note that the IIDC is not compelled to do the following:

- (a) Create new documents. For example, we are not required to write a new program so that a computer will print information in the format you prefer.

- (b) Perform research for you.

Time Limits

- **General**

The FOIA sets a time limit of thirty (30) calendar days for a decision to be made on whether to disclose the documents you have requested. If the HDC fails to meet the deadlines, the FOIA gives you the right to proceed as if your request has been denied. The HDC will try diligently to comply with the time limits, but if it appears that processing your request may take longer than the statutory limit, your request will be acknowledged, and advice of its status given. Since there is a possibility that requests may be incorrectly addressed or misrouted, you may call or write to confirm that the HDC has received the request and to ascertain its status.

- **Time Allowed**

The HDC will determine whether to grant your request for access to information as soon as practicable but no later than 30 days as required by Section 15 of the FOIA. If a decision is taken to grant access to the information requested, you will be permitted to inspect the documents or be provided with copies, if you so request.

- **Fees and Refunds**

The Freedom of Information Fees and Charges Regulations prescribe the fees incurred in making the documents available. You are entitled to receive the document(s) within seven days of payment of the relevant fee. If the HDC fails to provide the information within the seven days period, you are entitled to a refund of the fees paid, in addition to access to the document(s) requested.
