MADE BY THE MINISTER AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE CHIEF JUSTICE
UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)
(NO. 4) ORDER, 2009

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 4) Order, 2009.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule, being a Commonwealth citizen admitted to practise law in England and Wales for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago, subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule.

PART II

Mrs. Karen Louise Gough, is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an attorney-at-law in relation to all proceedings, suits or matters arising out of or in connection with the ICC Arbitration Case No. 13455/JNK/RBS–NH International (Caribbean) Limited (“NHIC”) Claimant, National Insurance Property Development Company Limited (“NIPDEC”) Respondent, including, but not limited to:
