# REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

## Act No. 1 of 2012

[L.S.]

An Act to supplement and vary the appropriation of the sum the issue of which was authorized by the Appropriation (Financial Year 2011) Act, 2012

[Assented to 25th January, 2012]

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as Enactment follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Finance (Supplementation and Variation of Appropriation) (Financial Year 2011) Act, 2012.

Further issue of \$2,702,305,000 from the Consolidated Fund 2. A further issue from the Consolidated Fund in the sum of Two thousand, seven hundred and two million, three hundred and five thousand dollars, is authorized for meeting expenditure for the service of the financial year ending 30th September, 2011 and appropriated in respect of the Heads of Expenditure set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Act.

Schedule

Increase in Heads of Expenditure Act. No. 7 of 2010 3. The sums appropriated to the Heads of Expenditure specified in the First Column of Part I of the Schedule to this Act by the Appropriation Act (Financial Year 2011) Act, 2010 are increased by the amounts specified in the Second Column of that Part.

Reduction in Heads of Expenditure 4. The sums appropriated to the Heads of Expenditure specified in the First Column of Part II of the Schedule to this Act by the Appropriation Act (Financial Year 2011) Act, 2010 are reduced by the amounts specified in the Second Column of that Part.

Sums appropriated in respect of Heads specified in Part II may be utilized Chap. 69:01 5. The sums appropriated in respect of the Heads of Expenditure specified in the First Column of Part II of the Schedule to this Act by the Appropriation Act (Financial Year 2011) Act, 2010 and not utilized at the commencement of this Act may be utilized, notwithstanding anything contained in the Exchequer and Audit Act, for the discharge of any liability incurred by reason of the increase in the expenditure in respect of the Heads of Expenditure specified in the First Column of Part I of the Schedule to this Act.
